Item pick-up is Sunday, October 9th, 1pm to 6 pm & Monday, October 10th, 8 am to 4:30 pm

· Livestock ENTRY forms taken on Friday, September 30th.

Do not bring livestock to the Fairgrounds until scheduled judging time.

•Enter Baked Goods & Fresh Flower Arrangements (Wild Flower and Garden Flower) on Monday, October 3rd, from 8 am - 1 pm.

Pick-up Baked Goods and/or Containers on Monday, October 3rd, from 5 pm - 6 pm

#### ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- (1) Before entering any category, you must present your EBCI enrollment card.
- (2) A W-9 form must be complete upon fair entry; separate W-9 forms are required for Qualla Arts & Crafts and the Cooperative Extension Center. When completing the W-9 form:
  - -Use your **LEGAL** name as it appears on your social security card.
  - -Use same name when submitting your entry; use of a different name could delay your prize winnings.
  - -When entering an item for a minor, use his or her LEGAL name and THEIR Social Security number.
- (3) You must have made what you are exhibiting within the last year (October 2015 through September 2016). Copyrighted items are not acceptable.
- (4) Items must fit into a category on this exhibit list to be eligible for a prize. The "Other" category is for any item that doesn't have a listed category.
- (5) Only one entry per person per category. With each entry, give your full legal name and age. Age verification checks may take place at the discretion of the Extension Staff. It is our goal to have a fair and age appropriate competition.
- (6) Cooperative Extension reserves the right to reject any entry.
- (7) Items are entered "at your own risk." Cooperative Extension can not guarantee the safety or condition of your exhibited items.
- (8) All prize money will be mailed to the winners.

Judges' decisions are final.
