9	Short Title:	an ordinance amending C.C. § 28-7 to state that an heir of a deceased enrolled
10	member does not have to sign a transfer document indicating receipt of a possessory holding from	
11	the estate of th	he deceased.

13	WHEREAS,	the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians established the Tribal Realty Office in 2016
14		to take over and perform certain realty services for Tribal members from the Bureau
15		of Indian Affairs (BIA); and
16 17	WHEDEAC	as the Tribal Bealty Office has grown and avanded it has continually looked to
18	WILKEAS,	as the Tribal Realty Office has grown and expanded, it has continually looked to improve the efficiency of administrative services it carries out on behalf of Tribal
19		members; and
20		memoers, and
21	WHEREAS,	the current practice for the administration of possessory holdings held by estates of
22		deceased enrolled members requires that the heirs sign the possessory holding
23		transfer document once Tribal Council has passed a resolution identifying and
24		recognizing the heirs; and
25 26	WHEDEAS	nothing in the Cherokee Code requires heirs to execute a possessory holding
27	WHEREAS,	transfer document to receive possessory holdings that they inherit; and
28		transfer document to receive possessory nordings that they fillerit, and
29	WHEREAS.	requiring enrolled member heirs to sign a transfer document to allow them to inherit
30		possessory holdings has, in many cases, led to the transfers and inheritance to be
31		delay for months or years when the heirs fail or refuse to come to the Tribal Realty
32		Office to execute the transfer and indicate receipt; and

34	WHEREAS,	to make the process clearer and more efficient, C.C. § 28-7 should be amended to
35		expressly state that persons inheriting possessory holdings pursuant to a resolution
36		of Tribal Council recognizing them as heirs of a deceased enrolled member do not
37		have to execute a transfer document to receive the inheritance.
38 39	NOW THE	REFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians in Tribal
40	The state of the s	il assembled, at which a quorum is present, that Cherokee Code Chapter 28 is hereby
41		led as follows:

43	Sec. 28-7. – A	administration of possessory holdings held in estates.
44	(a) Once t	he proper assignment and distribution of a possessory holding of a deceased enrolled
45	memb	er has been determined by the appropriate Tribal personnel, the Tribal Realty Office

1 shall draft the possessory holding transfer document memorializing the transfer of the 2 possessory holding from the estate of the deceased enrolled member to the heir. 3 4 (b) An heir of the deceased enrolled member shall not be required to sign the possessory 5 holding transfer document to receive the possessory holding and be recognized as the 6 holder of the legal interest thereof. 7 8 (c) Once the Tribal Realty Office has drafted the possessory holding transfer document, the 9 Realty Office shall submit the transfer document to the Tribal Business Committee for 10 approval pursuant to Cherokee Code Sec. 117-33. 11 (d) Upon approval of the transfer document by the Tribal Business Committee, the Tribal 12 13 Realty Office shall cause the document to be recorded in the Tribal record, and thereafter the Tribal Realty Office shall notify the heir that the document has been approved and 14 15 recorded and that the heir may obtain a copy of the transfer document from the Tribal Realty Office. 16 17 18 BE IT FINALLY ORDAINED that all ordinances that are inconsistent with this ordinance are 19 rescinded, and that this ordinance shall become effective when ratified by the Principal 20 Chief. 21 22 Submitted by Tribal Realty Services and the Office of the Attorney General
