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1 Cherokee Council House 2 Cherokee, Qualla Boundary (NC) SEP 0 3 2020 3 4 Date: 5 6 ORDINANCE NO. 26 (2020) 7 8 9 WHEREAS, The Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians established the Tribal Alcoholic Beverage 10 Control Commission by Ordinance 768 on September 8, 2011, and 11 12 WHEREAS, The Tribal Alcoholic Beverage Control Commission was established as an 13 independent entity of the Tribe to further promote the sovereignty of the Eastern 14 15 Band of Cherokee Indians; and 16 WHEREAS, The Tribal Alcoholic Beverage Control Commission pays for all salaries, 17 18 equipment, training and enforcement activities for the Tribal Alcohol Law 19 Enforcement Division (ALE); and 20 WHEREAS, The Tribal Council passed Ordinance 14, in 2017, amending Cherokee Code § 21 22 18B-500 provided the Tribal Alcoholic Beverage Control Commission direct 23 supervision over the daily activities of the ALE Enforcement agents; and 24 WHEREAS, That on August 6, 2020, Tribal Council Passed Ordinance 208, Cherokee Police 25 26 Commission amendments, which provided oversight authority of the ALE 27 Division to the Cherokee Police Commission; and 28 WHEREAS, Unlike the other law enforcement agencies of the tribe, the ALE Division was 29 30 already being managed by a Commission of duly appointed representatives of the 31 people, the Tribal ABC Commission, and that the Tribal ABC Commission is an 32 independent fee supported agency of the tribe that provides all funding, 33 budgeting, equipment, policies, procedures, and personnel management of the 34 ALE Division: 35 NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Tribal Council of the Eastern Band of 36 Cherokee Indians assembled, at which a quorum is present, that Cherokee Code Chapter 120 37 reads as rewritten: 38 39 "Chapter 120 - CHEROKEE POLICE COMMISSION 40 "Sec. 120-1. - Establishment. 41 The Cherokee Police Commission (CPC) is hereby established as an independent law 42 43 enforcement oversight arm agency of the Tribe. 44 "Sec. 120-2. - Purpose. 45 The purpose of the Commission is to provide performance and regulatory oversight of Tribal 46 law enforcement agencies and to act as the liaison between the community, law enforcement, and

the Executive and Legislative branches of Tribal Government providing transparency and advocacy to issues influencing crime and justice of Tribal trust lands.

"Sec. 120-3. - Definitions.

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The following words, terms and phrases as used in this chapter, shall be defined as follows:

- Commission shall mean the Cherokee Police Commission (CPC).
- (b) Commissioner and/or member shall mean an authorized member of the Cherokee Police Commission.
- Chairman Chair shall mean the Chairperson of the Cherokee Police Commission.
- Vice Chairman Chair shall mean the Vice-Chairperson of the Cherokee Police Commission.
- Law Enforcement Agency shall mean an agency responsible for enforcing the laws of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians, including but not limited to: the Cherokee Police Department (CPD), the Alcohol Law Enforcement Division (ALE), the Natural Resources Enforcement Office (NREO), Cherokee Animal Control (CAC), Marshall Service/Probation, and Detention Center.
- Law Enforcement Officer or Law Enforcement Official shall mean any authorized personnel delegated authority to enforce the laws of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians.

"Sec. 120-4. - Commission membership.

Nominations to serve on the Cherokee Police Commission are made by the Principal Chief. Tribal Council approves membership appointments and the Commission's annual work plan. The Commission shall consist of eight members, six of whom shall be members representing the six Tribal townships of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians, the other two representing one "at large" male and one "at large" female. The Cherokee Police Commission may recommend to Tribal Council Principal Chief that a member of the Commission be removed therefrom if a majority of the members of the Commission agree. Commissioners shall be removed from office by the nominating authority.

"Sec. 120-5. - Authority.

The Cherokee Police Commission is hereby vested with the following authority:

- (a) Oversight of all Tribal Law Enforcement programs. The Chief of Police and other Tribal Law Enforcement Managers shall manage the daily operations of their respective program and shall implement the Commission's policies and goals; the Chief of Police and other Tribal Law Enforcement Managers shall report to the Commission.
- (b) Review, amend amend, and approve as needed the agency policy and procedure manuals, handbooks, guidelines, or memorandums of understanding used by each agency.
- (c) (Repealed)
- (d) Formation of a system to receive, review, and monitor public complaints and concerns regarding law enforcement to ensure law enforcement agencies and officers are is meeting the needs of the community.
- (e) Hear final appeals from Law Enforcement Officers for discipline imposed by their respective Law Enforcement Program Manager, Chief of Police, or the Internal Review Board:

- (f) Review and make recommendations for the annual budgets prepared by Law Enforcement Program Managers and the Chief of Police providing advocacy and support for budgets to the Principal Chief and Tribal Council;
- (g) Review and make recommendations for the qualifications for each rank and grade in the law enforcement field and make recommendations as necessary to ensure consistency within tribal law enforcement agencies;
- (h) Review and make recommendations for the purchase and use of effective and necessary equipment used by or in connection with the operation of law enforcement departments programs: departments or programs;
- (i) Monitor the complaints made to all law enforcement agencies for officer misconduct to ensure the Chief of Police and other Tribal Law Enforcement Managers have responded to and taken appropriate action consistent with policy on law enforcement ethics and misconduct. And misconduct and to provide an annual report to the Chief and Tribal Council on this regarding complaints, resolutions, and potential training needs for officers.
- (j) Submit an annual report to the Principal Chief and Tribal Council containing quantitative and qualitative (performance) measures that illustrate how much and what type-the volume and of crimes are being reported, investigated, and charged in tribal, federal and state courts and how efficiently law enforcement is contribution to the justice system; system;
- (k) All Commissioners shall have the authority to vote on issues coming before the Commission:
- (l) To draft, approve approve, and implement protocols for the administration of duties placed upon the Cherokee Police Commission;
- (m) To share relevant information perspectives information and perspectives from other community groups, organizations and ororganizations, or constituencies with the Commission:
- (n) To represent the Commission at public events and other organizational meetings;
- (o) Serve on temporary committees or task groups that address specific work plan items;
- (p) Investigative subpoena power;

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- (q) Authority to review all personnel actions taken by each law enforcement agency in the course of its daily operations to ensure proper management and development of law enforcement officers and staff and to address concerns of law enforcement management in official reports to the Principal Chief and Executive Committee, Tribal Alcohol Alcoholic Beverage Control Commission, or other governing authority with direct responsibility for the agent; and
- (r) Serve as an outreach entity for citizens to submit law enforcement recommendations, complaints and/or commendations.

"Sec. 120-6. - Recommendations of the Commission.

The Commission shall consult with all tribal law enforcement agencies and their leadership prior to implementing new policy: however the decision of the Commission on law enforcement policy and the implementation of Commission goals shall be final and shall be fulfilled.

"Sec. 120-7. - Application of Chapter.

Notwithstanding the provisions of this Chapter, the Tribal ABC Commission, as the governing authority over the Alcohol Law Enforcement Division, shall have final decision making authority regarding all budgeting, policy, personnel, memoranda of understanding, mission, goals, and daily activities of the Alcohol Law Enforcement Division and its personnel as outlined in Cherokee Code § 18B-500. Any final decision issued in accordance with Cherokee Code §§ 18B-200(f) and 18B-500 by the Tribal ABC Commission, its Chair, or the Chair's designee, shall supersede a decision of the Cherokee Police Commission on that issue. A decision by the Tribal ABC Commission to override a decision of the Cherokee Police Commission informing the Cherokee Police Commission informing the Cherokee Police Commission of the decision and reason therefor."

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this amendment shall be effective upon ratification by the Principal Chief, and all prior ordinances and resolutions inconsistent with this ordinance are rescinded.
