Tribal communities honored by WNC Communities

C Communities celebrated 65 years of community achievement through the WNC Honors Awards Program held on Saturday, Nov. 22. Over 250 community leaders from 15 counties and the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians were recognized and rewarded for their exceptional community development programs at a luncheon at The Omni Grove Park Inn. Six communities with the Eastern Band of Cherokee were honored this year.

Community of Promise is the second highest honor with a cash award of \$1,000. Big Cove, Big Y and Towstring were three of 20 rural community associations from western North Carolina to receive this honor. They were chosen because of the initiatives implemented by the community that show promise and can be replicated around the region.

Birdtown, Paint Town and Yellowhill were honored as Participating Communities and received cash awards of \$300 each for their successful programs and projects implemented during the past year.
