## Rules:

**\*FOR ALL FLOATS BEING JUDGED: PLEASE HAVE TWO REPS FROM YOUR GROUP AT THE FLOAT UNTIL JUDGING IS OVER IN CASE YOUR DEPARTMENT/ORGANIZATION WINS. WHEN THE FIRE TRUCK SOUNDS ALL PARTICIPANTS THAT ARE BEING JUDGED WILL STOP WORKING ON THEIR FLOAT AND STEP AWAY. THE JUDGING WILL START IMMEDIATELY @ 2:30 PM, NO EXCEPTIONS. PLEASE HAVE ALL PARTICIPANTS THAT ARE TO BE JUDGED ON THEIR FLOAT AT THIS TIME, ALSO HAVE THE PARADE FORM/W-9 FORM FILLED OUT BY SEPT. 30, 2022, 4PM.**

**\*If you are riding a HORSE, the horse must wear a diaper or have a person following with a pooper scooper and bucket.**

## LINEUP

\* The entrance for parade floats will need to come in on 441 by the Casino Mart/McDonalds.

\*Floats that are participating in the judging will arrive at the parade lineup at these designated times: **Community – 11:00am-12:00pm, Childcare/Youth – 12:00pm-1:00pm, Business/Tribal Entities – 1:00pm-2pm (NO EXCEPTIONS)! Contestants for Miss Cherokee – 11:30am-12:30pm, Teen Miss – 12:30pm-1:15pm, Jr. Miss – 1:15pm-2pm, Little Miss – 2:00pm-3pm.**

All other entries can start arriving @ 12pm and in line by 3:00pm.

Drop offs can enter by the Tribal Pawn Shop traveling to the end of parking lot and turn left which the area will be marked to stop to let your parties off. There is no parking in this area. If children are being dropped off please have a chaperone for them.

\* Participant parking will be located at the Casino Parking Lot located by the Stonebrook Lodge. There will be shuttle service to bring you down to parade lineup.

\*The parade will start from the Casino Trail /intersection taking a left onto 19 South through downtown Cherokee, crossing the bridge turning right onto 441 North, go to the traffic light by the Museum of the Cherokee Indian and this is the end of parade. They will turn right across the bridge taking the roundabout up toward the Ginger Lynn Complex to disband.

\*Vehicles will disband to the left in GLW parking and all floats will disband taking the route behind Ginger Welch Complex.

\*All goodies must be handed out, not thrown from the floats. \*Once the Parade is in motion, **NO ONE** is to be jumping on or off of the floats/vehicles. Please wait until we reach the ending point of the parade before disbanding the float. All participants must stay on the float until the end!

I understand that in assuming these risks, I agree that under no circumstances will I or any person claiming through me make any claim or suit for personal injury, property loss or death against the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians (EBCI), partners, officers or employees alleging negligence, strict liability on the part of any of them. I also agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless all such persons as aforesaid for any and all claims for bodily injury, which may be made against any such persons connected with or arising out of the above named event.

I understand also that (1) the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians are relying on my agreement to these terms in granting me permission to participate in the above event; (2) In signing this waiver I acknowledge that I am in a physically fit enough shape to engage in this activity and I do not currently have any medical restrictions that would exclude me from engaging in this type of activity (3) my agreement to these terms is intended to release and absolve the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians (and its associated persons) from liability to the maximum extent.

I give my permission to the EBCI the right to take, use, reproduce, edit, photograph, record, broadcast, and otherwise exploit in all media, in whole or in part, including for commercial, promotion of the EBC and event, my and/or my minor child(ren) or ward's image, likeness voice, name and biographical information in connection with the event and release the EBCI from all claims, demands, suits, and liability that I or my successors and assigns may have for such use.

**Part I Taxpayer Identification Number (TIN)**

**Part II Certification**

Under penalties of perjury, I certify that:

1. The number shown on this form is my correct taxpayer identification number (or I am waiting for a number to be issued to me), and

I am not subject to backup withholding because: (a) I am exempt from backup withholding, or (b) I have not been notified by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) that I am subject to backup withholding as a result of a failure to report all interest or dividends, or (c) the IRS has notified me that I am no longer subject to backup withholding, and

**Certification instructions.** You must cross out item 2 above if you have been notified by the IRS that you are currently subject to backup withholding because you have failed to report all interest and dividends on your tax return. For real estate transactions, item 2 does not apply. For mortgage interest paid, acquisition or abandonment of secured property, cancellation of debt, contributions to an individual retirement arrangement (IRA), and generally, payments other than interest and dividends, you are not required to sign the Certification, but you must provide your correct TIN. **Purpose of Form**

A person who is required to file an information return with the IRS, must obtain your correct taxpayer identification number (TIN) to report, for example, income paid to you, real estate transactions, mortgage interest you paid, acquisition or abandonment of secured property, cancellation of debt, or contributions you made to an IRA.

**U.S. person.** Use Form W-9 only if you are a U.S. person (including a resident alien), to provide your correct TIN to the person requesting it (the requester) and, when applicable, to:

1. Certify that the TIN you are giving is correct (or you are waiting for a number to be issued),
  2. Certify that you are not subject to backup withholding,
- or
3. Claim exemption from backup withholding if you are a U.S. exempt payee.

**Note.** If a requester gives you a form other than Form W-9 to request your TIN, you must use the requester's form if it is substantially similar to this Form W-9.

For federal tax purposes you are considered a person if you are:

- An individual who is a citizen or resident of the United States,
- A partnership, corporation, company, or association created or organized in the United States or under the laws of the United States, or

• Any estate (other than a foreign estate) or trust. See Regulations sections 301.7701-6(a) and 7(a) for additional information.

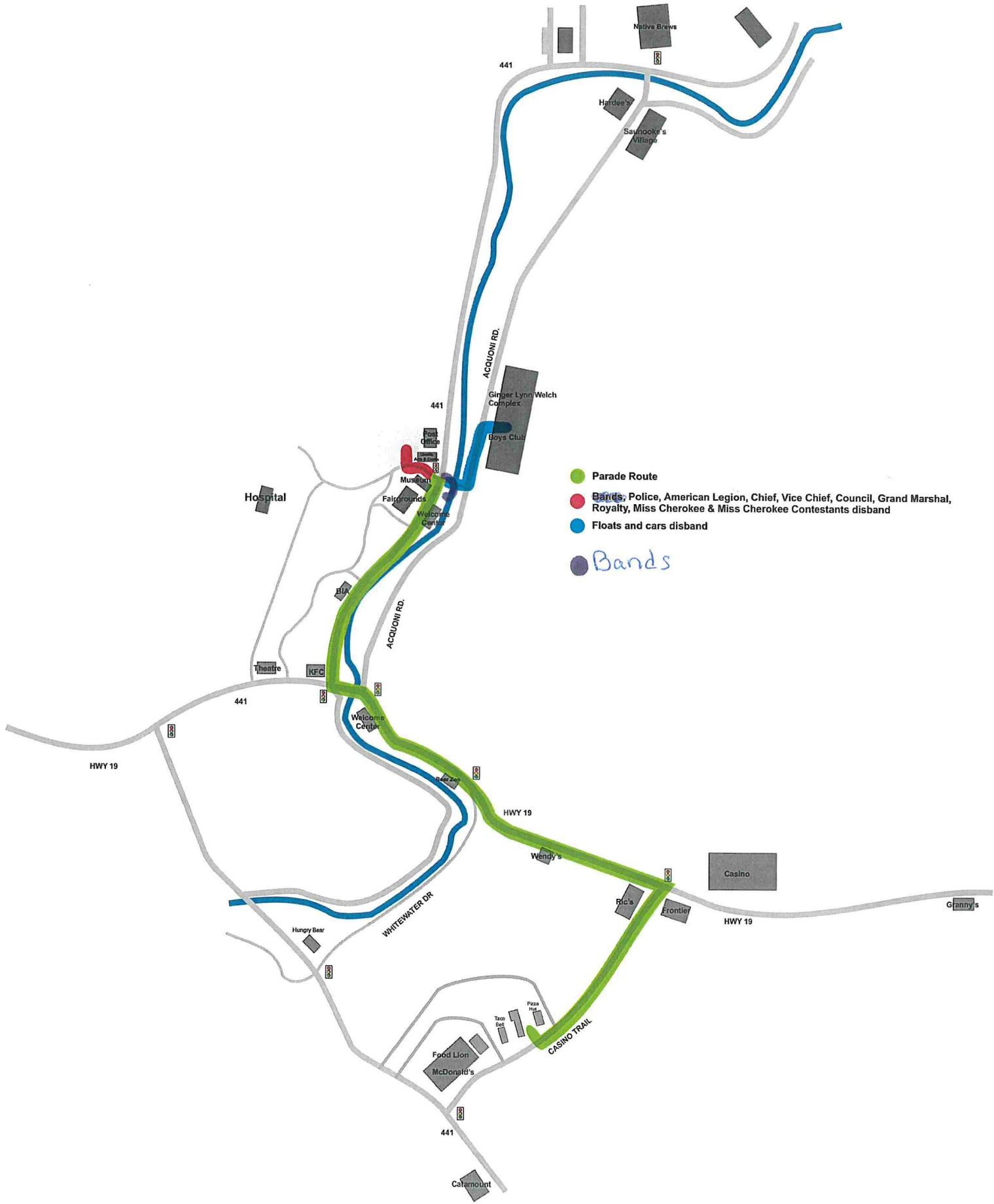
**Foreign person.** If you are a foreign person, do not use Form W-9. Instead, use the appropriate Form W-8 (see Publication 515, Withholding of Tax on Nonresident Aliens and Foreign Entities).

**Nonresident alien who becomes a resident alien.**

Generally, only a nonresident alien individual may use the terms of a tax treaty to reduce or eliminate U.S. tax on certain types of income. However, most tax treaties contain a provision known as a "saving clause." Exceptions specified in the saving clause may permit an exemption from tax to continue for certain types of income even after the recipient has otherwise become a U.S. resident alien for tax purposes.

If you are a U.S. resident alien who is relying on an exception contained in the saving clause of a tax treaty to claim an exemption from U.S. tax on certain types of income, you must attach a statement to Form W-9 that specifies the following five items:

1. The treaty country. Generally, this must be the same treaty under which you claimed exemption from tax as a nonresident alien.
2. The treaty article addressing the income.
3. The article number (or location) in the tax treaty that contains the saving clause and its exceptions.
