8	WHEREAS, the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians (EBCI) Tribal Government serves the
9	entire community of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians, and,
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11	WHEREAS, the community of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians is entitled to fully know
12	the actions of the government to the extent allowable, excepting information that would
13	potentially negatively impact the health, safety and prosperity of the Tribal Community, and,
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15	WHEREAS, the Office of Internal Audit and Ethics Committee are charged with investigations
16	of fiduciary and ethical behavior of officials of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians, and,
17	WHEREAS, the final reports on these investigations are reflective of the official's positive or
18 19	negative impact on health, safety, and prosperity of the Tribal Community, and,
20	negative impact on health, safety, and prosperity of the ritour community, and,
21	WHEREAS, the Section 117-107 does not include provisions to allow for the distribution of
22	final audit and investigative reports to the community
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24	NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Tribal Council of the Eastern Band of Cherokee
25	Indians in Council assembled at which a quorum is present that the Eastern Band of Cherokee
26	Indians does hereby amend the Cherokee Code as follows;
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28	Section 117-107. Reports.
29	(a) A = 424 D a = = 44
30 31	 (a) Audit Reports (1) A written report shall be prepared and issued by the Chief Audit and Ethics Executive
32	or designee following the conclusion of each audit. The report will be addressed to
32 33	appropriate management. Copies of the report will be distributed to the Principal
34	Chief, Vice Chief, Tribal Council and appropriate management. The appropriate
35	director and/or manager of the division, program or entity receiving the report shall
36	respond to the Office of Internal Audit and Ethics indicating within 30 days what
37	actions were taken or will be taken in response to specific report findings and
38	recommendations.
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40	(2) The director and/or manager receiving the report shall monitor to determine whether
41	progress is made toward correcting any unsatisfactory conditions. When requested
42	the director/or manager shall provide to the Office of Internal Audit and Ethics a
43	report on the status of corrective actions. The Office of Internal Audit and Ethics
44 45	shall determine whether the action taken is adequate to resolve audit findings.
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1 (3) If the action is not adequate, the Office of Internal Audit and Ethics will inform the 2 Executive Committee of the potential risk and exposure in allowing the unsatisfactory 3 conditions to continue. The Audit and Ethics Committee will be informed if the Executive Committee is the audited party. If appropriate action is not taken within an 4 5 acceptable timeframe, the Audit and Ethics Committee will be informed and allowed to exercise their authority as stated in Section 117-109(13) 6 7 8 (b) Investigative Reports 9 (1) A written report shall be prepared and issued by the Chief Audit and Ethics Executive or designee following the conclusion of each investigation. The report may be 10 deemed confidential and will be addressed and distributed to only appropriate parties. 11 12 13 (c) Reporting to the public 14 (1) All completed and final audit and investigative reports will be deemed public record 15 and will be provided immediately upon completion to the Tribal Media for 16 distribution to the public. 17 18 (2) Reports may be redacted or deemed confidential only by the approval of Attorney 19 General prior to being provided to the Tribal Media for public distribution. The 20 approval must be sought within 30 days of the completion of the report, or the entire 21 report becomes public record immediately and will be immediately made available to 22 the public at the end of the 30-day period.
