WHEREAS, during the time Mr. Cannon has coached the Cherokee students, the progress made in Athletics has been outstanding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians in Annual Council assembled at which a quorum is present that an expression of appreciation and gratitude is hereby extended to Doyce Cannon for the remarkable achievement and progress made by students of the Eastern Band in the field of athletics.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Doyce Cannon shall be made an honorary member of the Eastern Band of Cherokees with the name of Jb O'oad Jady in recognition of the achievement and progress in athletics made possible by his efforts.
