Resolution No. 121 (1974)

WHEREAS, James "Bo" Parris has been actively affiliated with the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians for many years, and

WHEREAS, During this time he has been a participant in community activities and served faithfully without compensation on many Tribal committees, and

WHEREAS, James Parris is the present Post Master of the Cherokee Post Office and he and his wife the former Gladys West live in the Big Cove area with their 2 children.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians in Annual Council assembled at which a quorum is present that an expression of appreciation and gratitude are hereby extended to James "Bo" Parris for his unselfish service to the Eastern Band for many years.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that James "Bo" Parris shall be made an honorary member of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians with the name of SFCI in recognition of services rendered the Tribe.
