RESOLUTION NO. <u>419</u> (2013)

WHEREAS,

In April, 2012 Michael and Mario Mazzariello, residents of New York State without any ties to the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians, happened upon a set of military medals in a pawn shop far from the Qualla Boundary. The medals included a Bronze Star, a Purple Heart and a Good Conduct Medal, awarded to Charles George in 1954; and

WHEREAS,

the Mazzariello brothers did not know who Charles George was but recognized the importance of returning the medals to their rightful owner. Therefore, the young brothers began a long search trying to locate Mr. George; and

WHEREAS,

Charles George was a member of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians and its only member to receive the Congressional Medal of Honor. Mr. George was killed in 1952 during the Korean Way, while serving as a soldier in the U.S. Army. He died while protecting members of his own unit from a grenade. He saved the lives of two of his fellow soldiers while giving his own; and

WHEREAS,

After much perseverance Michael and Mario Mazzariello confirmed E.B.C.I. member Charles George as the individual who had been awarded the medals they found. Michael and Mario returned the medals to Charles George's family in a ceremony on the Qualla Boundary on November 12, 2012; and

WHEREAS,

If it were not for the persistent efforts of these two young men, the family and Tribe of Charles George would not have these items of historical and personal significance originally awarded to an honored member of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians assembled, at which a quorum is present, the Tribal Council of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians hereby bestows the title "Honorary Member" to Michael and Mario Mazzariello for their friendship, dedication and extraordinary service to the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that this resolution shall be effective upon ratification by the Principal Chief.
