CHEROKEE COUNCIL HOUSE 1 CHEROKEE, NORTH CAROLINA 2 3 FEB 0 6 2025 Date: 4 5 6 ORDINANCE NO.: 390 (2025) 7 8 9 An ordinance to prohibit anyone from harboring, concealing, or assisting another person who has been banished from the Tribe 10 11 Whereas, Tribal Council has exclusive authority to banish or exclude persons from Cherokee 12 Lands; and 13 14 15 in Cherokee Code section 2-10, Tribal Council expresses its intent to prohibit Whereas, anyone from harboring, concealing, or assisting someone who has been banished 16 17 from Tribal lands; and 18 19 Whereas, to help effectuate Tribal Councils intent, and allow for the prosecution of section 20 2-10 of the Cherokee Code, that section needs to be amended and codified in and 21 existing section of Chapter 14 of the Code. 22 23 NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Tribal Council of the Eastern Band of Cherokee 24 Indians, in council assembled that the Cherokee Code is hereby amended as 25 follows: 26 Sec. 14-70.24. Harboring, concealing, or Aaiding the unlawful obtaining of services by 27 28 excluded persons. 29 30 It shall be unlawful for any person to aid or assist a person who has been excluded (a) 31 from Tribal lands pursuant to law to: 32 Harbor, conceal, or transport while on Tribal lands; or 33 (1) 34 35 Attempt to secure or to unlawfully secure any tribal benefit or service; or (1) 36 37 Apply for or attempt to claim any right, privilege or immunity by virtue of (2)38 membership in the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians except as provided by 39 law. 40 Harboring, concealing or Aaiding the unlawful obtaining of services by an excluded 41 (b) 42 person shall be punishable by a fine of \$5,000.00, and by imprisonment for a term not to exceed one year, a fine of \$5,000.00, or both. A person convicted of aiding 43 the unlawful obtaining of services by an excluded person under this section shall 44 45 serve a mandatory minimum sentence of 30 days imprisonment, which shall not be suspended. 46

BE IT FINALLY ORDAINED, that all ordinances and resolutions inconsistent with this ordinance are rescinded, and this ordinance shall become effective upon ratification by the Principal Chief.
