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43	NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Tribal Council of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians, in council assembled at which a quorum is present, that Cherokee Code		a quorum is present that Cherokae Code	
44	Chapter 75 is hereby amended as follows:			
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1 Sec. 75-55. Edito rial Board and Editor.

2	(a) An Editorial Board is hereby created and shall consist of all members of the One Feather
3	staff as well as one member appointed by the EBCI Executive Committee, and one
4	member appointed by the Tribal Council and a staff march of the EBCI Executive Committee, and one
5	member appointed by the Tribal Council, and a staff member from the EBCI Office of the
6	Attorney General designated by the Attorney General. The One Feather will provide
7	recommendations for the appointed seats. The appointed members will serve on the Board
8	indefinitely and will only be replaced if they resign their position or are removed by a
9	majority vote of the remaining members of the Board after being found in violation of the
10	Society of Professional Journalists Code of Ethics or subsection (e) in this Section.
11	Appointed Board members will be replaced by being appointed by the current body (i.e.
12	EBCI Executive Office or Tribal Council) that originally appointed the person leaving.
12	(b) All members of the Editorial Board certify that he or she will adhere to the standards of
	accepted ethics of journalism as defined by the Society of Professional Journalists and
14	endorsed by the Native American Journalists Association.
15	(c) The Editorial Board will develop written guidelines and policies for the publication of
16	articles, editorials, op-ed submissions and all other items published in the One Feather.
17	(d) The Editorial Board shall operate free from political influence from any Executive or
18	Legislative Officials of any Branch, Division or Department of the Government of the
19	Inbe.
20	(e) No Board member shall directly or indirectly, solicit, receive or in any manner be
21	concerned in soliciting or receiving any assessment, subscription or contribution for any
22	political organization, candidacy or other political activity, except to exercise his or her
23	right as a citizen to express his or her individual opinion and cast his or her right to vote.
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26	BE IT FINALLY ORDAINED, that all ordinances and resolutions inconsistent with this ordinance
27	are rescinded, and this ordinance shall become effective upon ratification by the
28	Principal Chief.
