RESOLUTION NO. _____ (2016)

- WHEREAS, the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians has the sovereign authority to exclude persons from lands of the Eastern Band in order to protect the integrity, law and order of those lands and the welfare of the members of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has codified its authority to exclude persons from the lands of the Eastern Band at Chapter 2 of the Cherokee Code; and
- WHEREAS, WILLIAM KRISTOPHER HARRIS, date of birth 04/30/1997, is not a member of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians; and
- WHEREAS, most recently, on or about 3/31/2015, a Domestic Violence Protective Order was issued against WILLIAM KRISTOPHER HARRIS which is set to expire on 3/31/2017; and
- WHEREAS, due to this protection order and his extensive criminal history in other jurisdictions which includes but is not limited to convictions for: DV Protective Order Violations; Possession of Marijuana up to ½ oz; Uttering Forged Endorsements; Possession of Stolen Goods/Property, and Felony Larceny, the Tribal Council has good reason to believe that WILLIAM KRISTOPHER HARRIS is a threat to the law and order on Tribal lands and a threat to the welfare of enrolled members.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council, in Council assembled with a quorum present and with the number of votes required by Tribal law, that upon release or transfer from the Cherokee Detention Center, WILLIAM KRISTOPHER HARRIS is hereby permanently excluded from all Tribal lands and is hereby notified and ordered to vacate all tribal lands upon such release or transfer.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this permanent exclusion prohibits WILLIAM KRISTOPHER HARRIS from entering on or being present on Tribal lands for any purpose except as required by a subpoena issued by Tribal Council or Tribal Court.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if WILLIAM KRISTOPHER HARRIS is found improperly on Tribal lands at any time after the effective date of this resolution, he shall be treated as a trespasser and appropriate legal action shall be taken against him.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that all resolutions inconsistent with this resolution are rescinded, and that this resolution shall become effective when ratified by the Principal Chief.
